Winter Heating Assistance

January - April

Salem Electric's Winter Heating Assistance Program is available to Salem Electric members whose household income does not exceed the income guidelines **AND** whose main heating source is electricity.

Priority is given to seniors (age 60+), and persons with disabilities (those receiving or having applied for monetary benefits for their disability). Seniors and persons with disabilities may apply beginning **December 1, 2011**. All others may apply beginning **January 4, 2012**.

Assistance is limited to one payment per heating season and ranges from \$150 to \$225.

The program ends April 30, 2012, or when funds are expended, whichever comes first.

Home visits are available for seniors and persons with disabilities. For more information, or to schedule an appointment, call Special Services Representative, Britni Davidson at **503 362-3601**.

Free Weatherization

Year Around

Salem Electric residential members (homeowners and renters) with permanently-installed electric heat whose household income does not exceed the income guidelines may qualify for free weatherization!

Eligible measures include: ceiling, floor, wall, and duct insulation, caulking and weatherstripping, and air sealing improvements. Incentives for window replacements are also available.

Members with heating fuels other than electricity, that meet the income guidelines, may qualify for other programs.
